

"THE WEALTH OF INTERNATION"

BERNARD STIEGLER WILL PRESENT A PUBLIC LECTURE, INSPECTING THE GLOBAL IMPACTS OF GENERAL SOCIAL AUTOMATION ON THE PROSPECTS OF HUMAN KNOWLEDGE AND INDIVIDUATION.

BERNARD STIEGLER IS A PROFESSOR AT THE UNIVERSITY OF TECHNOLOGY OF COMPIÈGNE WHERE HE
TEACHES PHILOSOPHY, HAVING PUBLISHED OVER 30 BOOKS ON PHILOSOPHY, TECHNOLOGY, DIGITIZATION,
CAPITALISM, AND CONSUMER CULTURE, STIEGLER IS RECOGNIZED AS ONE OF THE WORLD'S LEADING
THINKERS OF TECHNOLOGY'S INFLUENCE ON SOCIETY. THROUGH RIGOROUS INVESTIGATIONS OF
EMERGING FORMS OF INDUSTRIALIZATION AND AUTOMATION, HE HAS HAD A WIDE INFLUENCE IN MANY
FIELDS CONCERNED WITH THE HUMAN FUTURE, FROM ECONOMICS TO ENGINEERING, FROM POLITICS TO
ART. CONSIDERING THAT TECHNICS ARE ESSENTIALLY AND IRREDUCIBLY PHARMAKA • THAT ALL TOOLS ARE
BOTH POISONS AND REMEDIES • HE HAS INSISTED THAT WE DEAL WITH TECHNOLOGIES

PHARMACOLOGICALLY, AND THAT WE TRACE HOW TECHNICAL ENTITIES EVOLVE AND INTERACT
ORGANOLOGICALLY, CRUCIALLY, HE STRESSES HOW THESE CONSIDERATIONS INTERSECT THE ISSUES OF
THE ANTHROPOCENE, WHERE IT HAS BECOME URGENT TO RENEGOTIATE BOUNDARIES BETWEEN HUMAN.
